HISTORY OF ST. VALENTINE

We all know Valentine's Day as a day of love and gifts to people. But what is Valentine's Day and how was it officially started? The origins of the day are different as we know it now. The day is to celebrate two men from the third century. Both men were saints with the name Valentine. Ironically they both performed secret weddings, died on February 14th, and were both beheaded by Emperor Claudius. The day was originally established as Feast day to commemorate the Priest and Bishop that were executed. The Holiday did not become associated with love until the Middle Ages. The American poet Geoffrey Chaucer, while mainly known for writing "The Canterbury Tales" is also widely credited for associating Saint Valentine with love. Chaucer wrote the 699 line poem about how birds choose their mates on February 14th. The poem is called Parliament of Fowls and he wrote "For this was on Saint Valentine's Day, when every bird comes there to choose his mate". After this, Europe began to associate the day with love, but it was not big until Chaucer wrote poems to people he referred to as his Valentine's. Although some believe that Chaucer was not referring to February 14th but actually May 3rd which is also a day where many other Saint Valentine are to be honored and celebrated. So Valentine's day as we know it now because of a poem and a few love letters sent out.


MOVIE REVIEW

Strawberry Cake was actually a mini strawberry cake with strawberry icing. It was fluffy and moist. We ranked it a 7.



HOW TO HANDLE REJECTION


